Stop smoking to protect friends and family from household fires

Warwickshire residents are encouraged to give up smoking to improve their personal health and to protect friend and family members from household fires related to smoking.

Warwickshire County Council is supporting the annual Stoptober campaign and Warwickshire Fire and Rescue Service highlighting the dangers that smoking and smoking materials can pose. Government research states that there were 6,572 fire incidents recorded in the UK between 2020 and 2021 where smokers materials, cigarette lighters or matches were listed as the primary source of ignition for the fire. Smoking-related fires can be caused by people smoking in bed, knocking over ashtrays or leaving lit cigarettes unattended. These minor actions can have fatal consequences and in the same period there were 908 fatalities in the UK where smokers' materials were listed as the primary source of ignition for fire.

Covid19

The rate of infections across the district has decreased slightly to 566/100,000 from 604 last week, the over 60's rate has decreased to 105/100,000 (110 last week) with 45 cases over the last seven days. Other districts rates in Warwickshire, for all ages, are Nuneaton & Bedworth 642/100,000, North Warwickshire 435/100,000, Warwick 492/100,000 and Rugby 631/100,000. Warwickshire overall has gone up from 544/100,000 to 562/100,000. England 332/100,000.

There have been no further Covid related deaths this week across Stratford District (total now 148 from the start of this second wave (28th August 2020) 37 occurring in care homes, 99 in hospital, two in a hospice and 10 at home and one in a communal establishment, out of a total of 1,509 all cause deaths in the district for this new second wave period.

The cumulative total of deaths across Warwickshire for Wave 2 increased by 8 this week (725) with a total of 6,333 all cause deaths. The cumulative total of Covid-19 deaths in Stratford district is 316 since the start of the pandemic and in Warwickshire 1,326 (10,717 total deaths).
